### Road Name Change May Be Retained

Seven residents in the northwest section of Bloomfield Township who petitioned the township board to retain the name of Square Lake road in their neighborhood, were to be asked this week by the board to accept the change in name to North Square Lake road because of the confusion which would otherwise exist. Square Lake road at the east side of Square Lake, forks to the north and west and the township board proposes to keep the westerly fork of the road as Square Lake and the northerly branch as North Square Lake road.

Several roads in the township have multiple names, Lloyd B. Reid, township engineer, says, and the use of the names Bloomfield and Cranbrook have been abused by some real estate dealers until now there are such confusing duplications of names as Bloomfield Court, Bloomfield Terrace, Bloomfield road, Bloomfield street, and almost as many names for Cranbrook.
