"It is hoped that the newly-created Eccentric award for the year's outstanding service will result to all Scouts the fact that the greatest awards go not out to those seeking personal glory but to those conscientious, loyal, dependable Scouts willing to sacrifice personal ambition for the sake of advancing the benefits of Scouting. It is believed that the attempt to encourage service will be of considerable value to the Scouts and to the attainment of the goals desired."

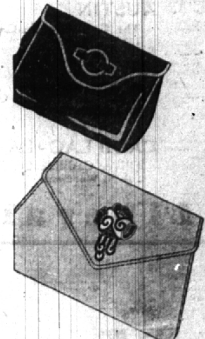
