BALDWIN TRIO BEATS MONROE DEBATE TEAM

Victory May Keep Village School In State Eliminations

NOW HAVE 11 POINTS

By winning their last debate of the preliminary series Friday afternoon at Baldwin high school with Monroe, Birmingham's debating team may continue in the elimination series sponsored annually by the Michigan High School Debating League.

In this contest, Birmingham had the affirmative side of the current question: "Resolved that National Chain Grocers operating in the state of Michigan are detrimental to the people of the state."

Although the trio was handicapped to some extent by the illness of one of their members they performed capably before a crowd of 60 Baldwin students who attended the debate.

Because of the try condition of the roads Monroe's team was late in arriving for the debate and though the contest was originally scheduled to begin at three o'clock it did not begin until an hour after that time.

Miss Masters Praised

Marion Masters spoke in place of Trishbridge Gail who, all Phyllis Huston and Joseph Huston completed the personnel of the team.

In awarding the decision to the Baldwin trio the critic judge, Preston Scott, head of the speech department at the Detroit City College, remarked that Marion in her performance did not appear inexperienced and he was surprised to learn that this was her first appearance in a debate.

Melvin C. Hart, principal of Baldwin High School, presided at the contest. Miss Holmes is the coach of the Monroe team.

The next step for the Baldwin trio will be the elimination debates in which they may or may not be entered. If there are more than 12 teams with points over 11 Birmingham will not continue in the race. Coach H. F. F. Carver, of the Baldwin team, will receive word within the next two weeks from the league manager, E. H. Deans, as to Birmingham's status in the preliminaries.

So far this year the Maroon and White trio has scored 11 points in the preliminaries. Having the

negative side of the resolved question they beat Ann Arbor 2-1. Sgt. James J. O'Connell, who switched to the affirmative side and was defeated by Flint Northern, was the victor over Monroe by a similar rating. One point is awarded to the winners in each contest.

Though they may not continue in the race Birmingham has had a successful debut. The victors won three contests and losing one.

Maples Top Monroe Five 25 to 20

The Maple City basketweavers showed their best form of the season when they defeated the larger Monroe High School five on the Baldwin floor Friday night by a 25-20 score.

At no time were the visitors in the lead. The Maples started with a three-point margin in the first quarter and carried an advantage over the Scarlet team throughout the game. In the last period the Monroe quintet, making a wild dash for victory, made one goal and held the Maples to the same total, but the going rang before any further scoring was possible.

Roland Brown, lanky Maple center, accounted for the greatest number of points in the course of the contest. Brown scored five field goals for a total of ten points, to be followed a close second by John Chandler, Birmingham forward, who scored three. For both schools most of the scoring came in the first half.

The five who started the game for Baldwin played throughout its entire period without substitution for the first time this season. Monroe made only two substitutions.

After two weeks of holiday practice, including a regular session on New Year's day, the Maples are in excellent condition and out to seek a crushing defeat for the Royal Oak on the Baldwin floor tomorrow night.

Royal Oak so far has played six games, losing three. Baldwin has won three out of four starts, the only loss being to Hantrank, while Royal Oak's losses have been to Detroit Western, Pontiac, and Flint Central. The Aces have to date triumphed over Hazel Park, River Rouge, and Fordson.

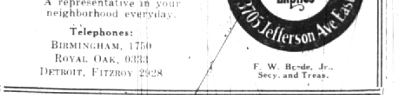
