ADAMS TAKES ACTIVITY CUP

Leads Barnum To Junior High Championship By Three Points

Consistent performance in both the girls' and the boys' divisions has given Adams Junior High School the championship for the first time in the village Junior High school activity race. The final summary released Monday shows the Trojans from Adams with a total of 111 points to lead Barnum by a scant three points.

The final ratings gave Barnum 108 points for a big lead over Baldwin Junior High School, which registered 105 points to place third in the race. In both the girls' and the boys' divisions Adams' students were victorious and as both departments are figured in the rating, their consistent performance won them a leg on the activity cup.

Adams registered two firsts in major sport activities, triumphing in the boys' basketball league and taking first in the girls' division of the annual track meet held last week. But on the other hand, Adams finished last only once in 17 activities that count towards possession of the cup.

The performance of Barnum school, came as the biggest surprise the newest junior high school in the village taking firsts in four major activities, counting them in boys' swimming, tennis and track, and in girls' swimming. Barnum boys, though none had competed actively in interschool sports until this year, came through in great style under the direction of E. T. Engel, boys' physical education director at Barnum. The Barnum boys scored 72 points to lead this half of the activity schedule. But although Barnum students were strong this year in the boys' half they ran a poor third in the girls' division.

Baldwin Junior High school, the senior entrant in the circuit, placed a bad third in the final summaries, taking but one first in a major activity throughout the year.

Major activities in the league give points on the 10-10.5 ratio, while minor activities are judged on the 5-5.1 rating.
