The schedule, which calls for each team to meet every other team twice, will be played in two rounds, the winners of each to play for the division title in a three-game series.

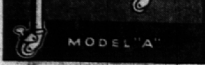
Afterwards the champions of each division, the commercial and organization, will play for the community championship and cup.
