

Village Schools Close Friday

2471 Students Complete Semester's Work In Birmingham Public Schools

Birmingham village schools will close tomorrow with 2471 students receiving promotion or repeat slips to complete the second semester of school work. The year's registration in Birmingham public schools was 2629, but withdrawals and transfers make the June total considerably smaller.

Baldwin High School registration for next year will be augmented by the addition of 104 ninth grade graduates from Adams and Baldwin Junior High Schools. This increase will be offset by the probable small 75 entry from Quarten Grade School. Only 25 are expected to enroll from Quarten at Baldwin Junior High in September. Exactly 75 seniors leave Baldwin this semester.

Adams Junior High School will have the usual increase of approximately 25 enrollments, but at Birmingham at commencement exercises held Tuesday afternoon. Eight of the graduates received scholastic awards.
