Building and Loan Associations To Pay \$4,000,000 Dividends

Lansing.—Over \$4,000,000 will be paid out in dividends by building and loan associations in Michigan on June 30, records of the department of state show. A survey of the field indicates that building and loan companies are operating at a more normal rate than at any time since late 1929.

Total investment in building and loan associations, in approximate figures, are \$170,000,000 during the year ending June 30. Statistics in the department of state indicate that practically the entire gain has been made since Mrs. L. Chung the last six months of 1930, the gain in assets, was so slight as to be negligible.
