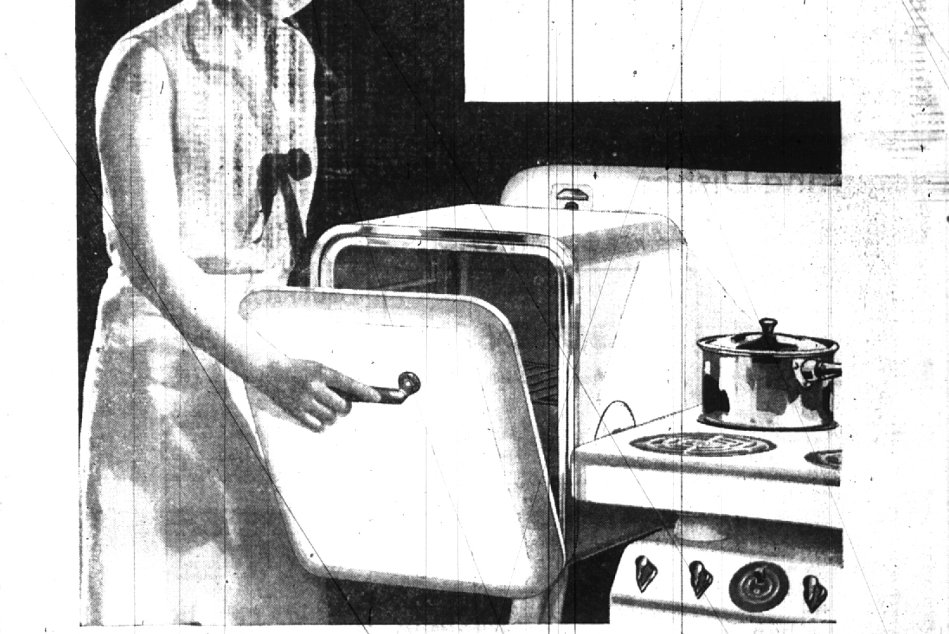
Birthdays Feature Assembly Program
