

PARK PREPARES FOR RATE CHANGE

Membership Golf Course Ready for Distribution

The new membership cards for residents and property owners in Bloomfield Township, extending special privileges on the Bloomfield Township Park golf course, are now ready for distribution, it was announced yesterday by Jimmy Dolan, club-house manager. The cards were made up after recent meeting of the Bloomfield Township Board, which controls the park, at which the fees for outsiders were raised to 50 cents for week days and \$1 for Saturdays, Sundays and holidays. The membership cards, to be used only to residents or property owners in the township, entitled the holders to play at the previously established rate of 35 cents for holes on any day. The higher rates for outsiders will go into effect as soon as notices of the change have been posted about the course, Dolan said.

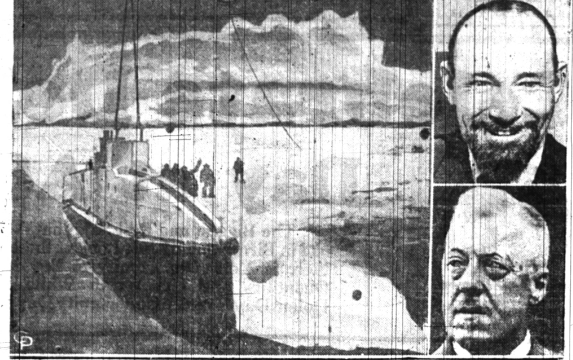

The annual poppy sale sponsored by the American Legion Auxiliary will be held on May 23. Proceeds from the sale of these flowers, which are symbolic of the men who lost their lives in the World War, will be used to further the welfare work undertaken by the Legion and the auxiliary. The poppies are not machine-made, but are the work of disabled veterans who are in hospitals, inmates of hospitals or in convalescent work-shops maintained by the auxiliary. In some cases when veterans are too badly disabled to make complete flowers, they form small groups called "Poppy Pioneers." Each man does his bit, though he may be blind or crippled. The veterans are paid one cent each for the poppies. The Birmingham branch of the auxiliary will hold a business meeting at the Community House Tuesday at 8 P. M.
