Matthews Retrial On Manslaughter Charge Postponed

Maher in Detroit Monday, has been postponed indefinitely by agreement between the prosecutor and attorneys for the defense. Matthews, who practices law in Pontiac, is accused of being the driver of the car which fatally injured Mrs. Martha Ann Brady at the corner of Seven Mile road and Woodward avenue last Dec. 3. The jury disagreed when he was first tried in March.

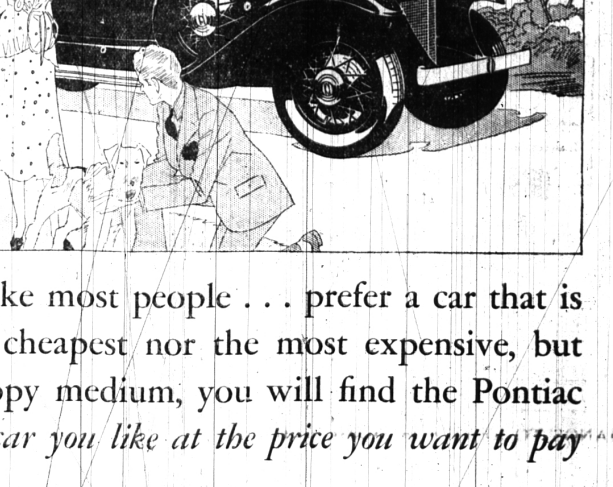
