\$8854 Loaned Through College Fund Since 1922

According to figures released by the Birmingham Scholarship Fund Association at its quarterly meeting held May 20, \$8854.03 has been loaned to students at college since the fund was established in 1922 and \$8400 is on hand to be loaned on September 1, 1931.

The fund reported assets of \$9793.02, a gain during the past year of \$894.56. Loans of \$1700 were made to students on Feb. 1, 1931, and 11 students in various colleges now are being financed in part by the association.

The fund has applications on file for nine loans in September, 1931, totaling \$1350. Two borrowers from the fund made final repayment while several made partial payments during the past quarter, and \$1178.07 from all sources was received.

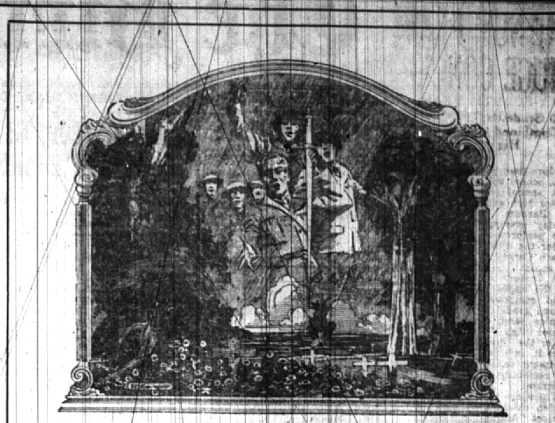
13 STUDENTS ELECTED TO HONOR GROUP
