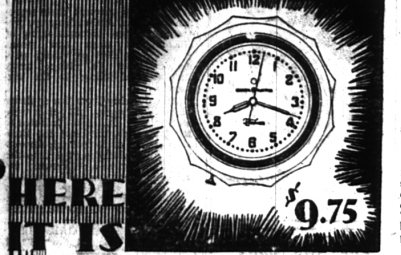

A CHA WITH SENATOR COUZENS. DONOR OF MILLIONS TO THE PEOPLE. WHAT CAN BE DONE NOW. II.—SUGGESTIONS FOR UNEMPLOYMENT RELIEF

(This is the second of a series of articles on Senator James Couzens, donor of millions, and his views on unemployment.) By LESLIE RICHEL, Staff Writer Senator James Couzens of Michigan, who has offered a million dollars for the relief of unemployed, has three specific plans for relief.

First, he would obtain temporary relief by a combination of federal and state aid. A bold "Would you let people starve, people who are willing to work, because of a word?" the senator counters. Secondly, he would have a greater distribution of earnings to workers.

Where Should Earnings Go? "The time has come when the economic system will not stand up under a plan by which the employer, who has displaced 10 men by a machine, keeps the earnings of nine men, considering it his own.

When not required for unemployment benefits, the money would be used for the making of loans to working people. The administration would be in the hands of a federal commission, at the center of a central stabilization bank in Washington.

The insurance would be put into effect when employment in a given state falls below 85 per cent of the preceding three years' average—and it would end after the return of employment to 90 per cent of normal.

When the federal action is necessary, was necessary long ago. No city or state can adequately cope with the problem of unemployment chests or the Red Cross.

Community chests have their own groups to support in Detroit, the Community Fund supports some 80 agencies. It may be remarked that Senator Couzens has, with the exception of one year, been the largest donor to the Detroit Community Fund, giving from \$100,000 to \$200,000 annually.

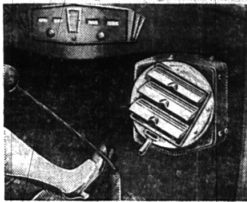
