More than 4,000 persons were gathered in the place of the world's greatest living violinist. They were thrilled, of course, and he was the professional heights of a Kreisler; the wonderful thing to me is this: that God's Universe holds within it the great science of melody, allowing properly instructed and inspired people to bring into existence a few of its angelic harmonic sounds.

As Kreisler drew out of his violin strains that set one's emotions struggling up the invisible and infante World of Music... The controversy had ended in the offer of Township Supervisor Perry A. I thought of the World of Life... of human life, and its ability to transcend all human attainments when the bow of love was drawn across the hearts of men and women, boys and girls, and the World of Happiness that surrounds all of us, waiting to be drawn forth into human comprehension under the spell of an artist—an artist in the art of right thought, and the attitude of a Kreisler performance (or any other comparable display of art) which has not only more and more convinced that peace and contentment is ours any day, and will be ours any day, of practicing to exemplify the high and lofty attributes that are the result of the expression all the finest in music; but it is the expression of his bow over the strings, fingers, and the same time with his hands, and the harmonious feelings, life is that way, you know the kind of melody that you have learned to play; concord or discord.

COMMITTEE ON BUDGET

Too Late To Pare Township Tax Levy, Property Owners Say
CITE OFFICE ADVANCE.

The committee from the Property Owners' Division of the Birmingham Real Estate Board which was appointed two weeks ago to make recommendations for reductions in the Bloomfield Township budget after the Division had claimed the budget had been passed "at a secret and unpublic hearing," today had given up all attempts at paring down the budget. The committee had complimented the township for improvements in office equipment.

Groups Disagree
The committee had been appointed to pass on the budget but had stirred a heated controversy between the Property Owners' Division and members of the Township Board. The Division had claimed that it had an agreement with the township to reduce the amount that will be levied on the tax roll, and that it was "very much pleased" that it had been during the last year in developing and systematizing the township.

Water Tax Rolls Spread
