MRS. JAMES R. POTTS. Funeral services were held recently for Mrs. James R. Potts (Frudence Ann West Whitling), formerly a resident of Birmingham, who died on Nov. 8, the day of her 74th birthday anniversary.

She was born in Detroit on Woodward avenue, five doors north of Grotius avenue on Nov. 6, 1857, and first attended school in the city of Pontiac, now stands opposite Hudson's Store.
