## Hazel Park Man Dies In Hospital After Collision Near Here

One person is dead and two others, including a 16-year-old girl, are suffering severe injuries today as the result of an automobile collision at East Maple and Rochester roads, early Friday night.

Frank Seaman, 22 years old, 122 Annabelle avenue, Hazel Park, died in St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Pontiac, the following afternoon. He was the driver of a car which collided with another driven by Grant F. Staring, 42 years old, of 415 West Fourth street, Rochester.

Both Staring and his daughter, Donna, 16 years old, were cut seriously about the head and face.

# Get Surplus Food From Farms To Needy, Pleads Fletcher, Florida Senator

## Cost of Transporting Overproduction Of Crops To Congested Centers Should Be Reduced To Permit Immediate Aid, Siles Declares

(Oponka Upland Fletcher was born in Sumter County, Georgia, Jan. 8, 1882. He is a graduate of the law in 1888. He has practiced law at Jacksonville, Fla., ever since. He was a member of the Florida house of representatives for a term, and then mayor of Jacksonville from 1922 to 1923 and in 1924. In 1905 he was made chairman of the Democratic state committee. In 1908 he was appointed United States senator, and died the same year. He is now serving his fourth term.)

TEMPORARY relief for unemployed and depressed economic conditions may result from artificial means, but the only permanent solution is to increase natural production of food of all kinds, and that would be accomplished by cutting down on farm products.

There is an ample supply of food of all kinds in the country, but the trouble is in getting it to the people who need it. The surplus of crops is being piled up in congested centers, while the people who need it are suffering from lack of food.

It is this congestion of the executive branch of the government which will consider another emergency

footstuff is going to waste in many agricultural sections as well as the surplus of crops in congested centers. There is a need of relieving the unemployment problem to use the resources of the war department in the way of putting tents and cooking facilities at the disposal of the unemployed.

We have any amount of food in this country. There is not an agricultural product of any material importance that we do not have in overproduction of. The government could arrange to get the surplus of the commodities now at the cheapest price for years to the consumers who are in need of it and that would help. The trouble is in the means of getting it to the consumers.

# BUCK HEARS 66 CASES IN MONTH

## Justice Collects \$1824.60 In Fines And \$259.80 In Costs

Justice Floyd S. Buck heard 45 cases for Birmingham Hills village, 15 for Birmingham and six for the county during September. Birmingham cases heard in his court included seven for speeding, one for reckless driving, two for drunk driving, one for violating traffic signals, one for illegal parking, two for disorderly conduct and one for violating the dog ordinance. Fines amounted to \$256.60 and costs to \$66.00.

Birmingham cases presented him with 23 persons charged with disorderly conduct, seven with trespassing, six with drunk driving, six with reckless driving and one with violating traffic signals. Fines in these cases totalled \$13.50 and costs \$18.00.

For the county, Judge Buck heard on charge of carrying concealed weapons, one of violating the fish laws, two of driving a taxicab driver, one of disorderly conduct and one of drunk driving. Fines amounted to \$32 and costs to \$13.20.
