BOARD OF EDUCATION
Birmingham, Michigan
September 22, 1931

At a special meeting of the trustees of School District No. 1 Fractional of Bloomfield, Troy, Royal Oak and Southfield Townships, Oakland County, Michigan held at 22:45 of September 22, 1931.

Present: Ray A. Palmer, W. G. Hutchinson, John E. Martin, Earl G. Potter and F. F. McKinney constituting a quorum.

Absent: None.

Resolution introduced by Martz, seconded by Potter.

WHEREAS, school District No. 1 Fractional of Bloomfield, Troy, Royal Oak and Southfield Townships, Oakland County, Michigan borrowed One Hundred Thousand, Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$101,250.00) on May

25th, 1931, against the taxes of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1931, in accordance with, sub-section 1 of Section 1 of Act 26, Public Acts of 1931, and eleven (11) notes were issued, ten (10) of which notes being numbered one (1) to ten (10), inclusive, were in denominations of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) each, and note number eleven (11) being in the denomination of Twelve Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1250.00), all of which notes bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, being dated May 25, 1931 and due Sept. 28, 1931.

AND WHEREAS, the collection of taxes for the year ending June 30, 1931, had not been sufficient to pay said notes in full at maturity there having been collected only Fifteen Thousand Six Hundred and Five Dollars and Ninety Six cents, (\$15,605.96).

AND WHEREAS, School District No. 1 Fractional of Bloomfield, Troy, Royal Oak and Southfield Townships, Oakland County, Michigan desired to renew the amount of said notes as herein authorized, in accordance with the provision of Act 26, Public Acts of 1931, of the State of Michigan, said notes to be paid from the collection of delinquent taxes of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1931, which taxes remain unpaid in the amount of One Hundred and Forty Three Dollars and Fourteen cents (\$153,235.14), of which this loan shall constitute approximately fifty-six per cent (56%).

AND WHEREAS, there are no other loans outstanding against the delinquent taxes of 1930.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the President and Secretary of School District No. 1 Fractional of Bloomfield, Troy, Royal Oak and Southfield Townships, Oakland County, Michigan, be and hereby are authorized to sign notes on behalf of said school district, in the amount of Eighty Five Thousand Six Hundred and Forty Four Dollars (\$85,644.00), said notes to consist of eight (8) notes in the denomination of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) each, and one (1) note in the denomination of Five Thousand Six Hundred Forty Four Dollars (\$5,644.00), all of said notes to be dated September 28, 1931, and due March 28, 1932, with interest at the rate of five per cent (5%) per annum, payable quarterly, and that said notes, when properly executed, be delivered to the First Detroit Company, Detroit, Michigan, as a renewal of the unpaid balance of notes due Sept. 28, 1931.

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that the said school district hereby agrees to deposit in a special sinking fund, all of its 1930 delinquent tax collections, and not to use or pay out any of such delinquent tax collections except for

the purpose of paying the notes hereby authorized, or any renewal thereof, in accordance with, sub-section 1 of Section 1 of Act 26, Public Acts of 1931, and eleven (11) notes were issued, ten (10) of which notes being numbered one (1) to ten (10), inclusive, were in denominations of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) each, and note number eleven (11) being in the denomination of Twelve Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1250.00), all of which notes bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, being dated May 25, 1931 and due Sept. 28, 1931.
