

New York Astounded At Size of Fortune Left By Famous Sportsman

Estate of Payne Whitney, Largest in History, Appraised At \$239,301,017, Increased \$82,721,270 In Value After Capitalist's Death

By Central Press New York—New York, rarely surprised, has taken by the enormity of the estate left by the late Payne Whitney, capitalist and sportsman, who died on May 25, 1927. The valuation of the Whitney estate, just filed and made public, is the largest in the history of America—\$239,301,017, even though Mr. Whitney gave much during his life.

New York, of course, realized that Payne Whitney was an exceptionally wealthy man. But the beneficiaries or distribution of estate prior to death to avoid inheritance taxes, the millionaires of wealthy folk have not been so much as surprised.

The principal feature of the Payne Whitney estate was the fact that, of his own accord, it created \$22,721,270 in value in the two years following his death, the estimate having been made in 1929. But, the collapse of the stock market, this gain was lost in the two years following the appraisal.

Mr. Whitney's brother, Harry Payne Whitney, likewise a multi-millionaire, to whom were left two valuable stallions, died last year of pneumonia. (Both men had racing stables).

Generation Passes Thus, within a few years, the heirs of William C. Whitney died, and the vast fortune moved on to a new generation and estate taxes on the Payne Whitney estate amounted to \$79,274,142, which the state of New York received \$17,364,012, the federal government \$29,013,015, and other states \$26,376, and other states \$44,385.

On the idea of the immensity of the Payne Whitney estate, one has only to compare it with the estate of John D. Rockefeller, who died in New York state, that of Mrs. Stephen V. Harkness (all held) worth \$107,000,000. There came in order: Colonel John Jacob Astor (real estate), \$87,217,691; Pleasant M. Whitney (banking), \$79,143,924; Anthony J. Brady, \$79,042,443; Henry C. Frick, \$74,300,000; William G. Vanderbilt (brother of John D.), \$67,647,662; John S. Kennedy, \$67,137,300; Russell Sage, \$61,653,800; Charles W. Harkness, \$60,900,000; Edward H. Harriman, \$58,000,000; William K. Vanderbilt, \$55,530,966; William A. Clark, \$48,717,157; James Stillman, \$40,113,121; D. Ogden Mills, \$35,000,000; Jacob H. Schiff, \$34,426,288, and Oliver H. Payne, \$32,000,000.

Real Estate The estate of the late Thomas Fortune Ryan, not yet appraised, is believed to be \$125,000,000, this being second to Mr. Whitney's. Chief beneficiary of Payne Whitney's fortune was his wife, Helen Hay Whitney, daughter of the late John Hay, secretary of state under President Roosevelt. Mrs. Whitney received \$81,132 in personal property, and a residence share in trust amounting to \$68,102,816.

John Hay Whitney, a son, received a residuary share in trust amounting to \$31,551,408; while John Whitney Payson received \$21,551,408 in trust, and her husband, Charles S. Payson, \$3,286,600. Three friends were left \$500,000 apiece: Finley Peter Dunne (editor of "Mr. Dooley"), North H. Hale, Jr., former member of the New York Stock Exchange, and Samuel A. Clark, architect and member of the New York Racing commission. Nearly a million in smaller sums was left to other legatees.

Charitable and educational institutions were given \$67,704,082. The largest sums were left to New York Hospital, \$21,691,593; New York Public Library, \$20,830,649; Cornell University, \$23,886,646; Groton School, \$1,314,642; and Nazarene Hospital, \$1,000,000.

Over-Exerted A few hours prior to Mr. Whitney's death he had been playing tennis at his country home, in Manhattan. Philip Beyer, who was a house guest, after the first gets Mr. Whitney complained of feeling ill and retired to a lounge adjoining the court. In less than half an hour Mr. Whitney died of heart trouble and exhaustion.

Mr. Whitney was born in New York and educated at Yale, but studied law at Harvard. Mr. Whitney entered business soon after his marriage to Miss Helen Hay. By 1924 his paid income tax of \$20,411 was exceeded only by that of Henry Ford and John D. Rockefeller.

Mr. Whitney gave many beneficiaries during his life, millions going to the New York hospital in addition to the large sum left in the will.
