the public think he was economical so he tried to slash off a million dollars from the budget as it left the recent Legislature. The Supreme Court, however, held his slashing to be illegal, on the grounds that it was not within the Governor's power partially to veto items. The Governor, of course, wants to keep the total state expense below that of his predecessor, even though, as State Treasurer Howard Lawrence pointed out, it would create a larger state deficit next year. We are fond of Governor Brucker after a fashion, but fear that his zealotry for re-election is thwarting his business sense. If only he would exercise the duties of his office more along economic lines, and less along political angles, he would make fewer mistakes. Certainly, in interpreting his notions of "kitchen economy," we dislike to nourish the belief that perhaps it majors in such culinary objectives as a mere personal attachment for luscious edibles, such as cherries and peaches.

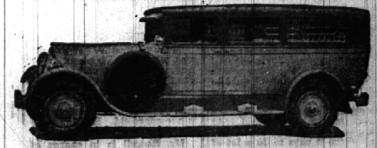
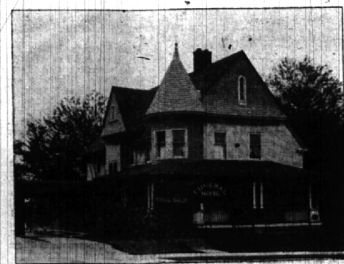
