Lortrey, home secretary of the American Baptist Foreign Mission Society, will be chief speakers at the annual state Baptist convention to be held here Oct. 19-22, according to the program released yesterday.

SOUNDS VILLAGE

On the 19th, 20th, 21st and 22nd days of October the Michigan Baptists' Convention will be held in the village and will be attended by approximately 1,000 persons. It is expected that Birmingham will provide housing and other accommodations for approximately 400. 

Both Governor Brucker and Dr. Lortrey will address the convention banquet to be held in the parlors of the First Baptist church here Wednesday evening, Oct. 21, the attendance at which will be limited to 400 guests. Dr. Lortrey will also speak at the Wednesday afternoon session on the subject, "The Uplifted Christ in Our Land."

Dr. Kinney will deliver the opening address of the convention Monday evening, Oct. 19, and will also speak at the ministers' meeting which will constitute part of the convention program the following morning. Several other prominent speakers, both men and women, will address other sessions of the convocation. About 1,000 delegates and guests are expected to attend at various times during the four-day period.

Myers, pastor of the Michigan Baptist Women's Missionary Society will hold a separate meeting Tuesday morning.

Atkins Is Returned To Birmingham Church For 7th Consecutive Year

Rev. R. M. Atkins was reappointed to the pastorate of the First Methodist Episcopal Church of Birmingham by Bishop Thomas Nicholson at the annual Detroit conference of the Church which closed Monday.

At the convention, Mr. Atkins was chairman of the committee on social and moral reform which brought in three recommendations on world peace which are to be forwarded as memorials to the next annual convention in Atlantic City next May.

The recommendations included the granting of exemptions from military service to conscientious objectors, the discontinuance of the draft, and the abolition of the military education program in schools, colleges and universities.

Parry Opposes Ban On Car Allowance For Village Aides
Spread of the village's policy of economy to include the abolishment of automobile allowances for municipal employees met with little favor from Manager James W. Parry in a report to the Commission Monday night.

At his recommendation the allowance, which amounts to \$103.50 monthly, will be somewhat reduced, but will not be discontinued entirely as had been suggested by Commissioner Lawrence Maurice Lowman at a previous meeting.
