B. D. Sales Plan Will Provide 40 Jobs

Township Supervisor Perry A. Vaughan and Frank E. Sternal, local Firestone dealer, are co-operating today in a plan whereby from 35 to 40 men on the township welfare list are expected to be supplied with jobs.

The plan provides for the sale of 25 cent coupon service books by the welfare list members of the village, which will be divided into definite territories to avoid duplication.

The welfare salesman will keep for himself the 25 cents paid for each book, and the purchaser will be refunded the purchase price of the book when it is presented to the Firestone Service Station South Woodward and Darnestreet. The coupons in the book will then be redeemable for services at the station at a 10 percent discount.

The plan here is being worked out in conjunction with a nationwide project sponsored by Firestone. It is already in operation in several Oakland County communities, where it is said to be furnishing real relief to welfare subjects.

The coupon books will be placed in the hands of welfare men here Friday, Mr. Vaughan said.
