## RITES HELD FOR REV. JOHN O. SAUL

Veteran Packard Employee, 66 years old, a retired veteran employee of the Packard Motor Company, who died suddenly Friday when stricken with apoplexy at his home, 384 Chesterfield road, Birmingham, N. J., he became a regularly ordained minister in the Methodist Episcopal Church out of interest for church work, though he never followed preaching as a profession. He moved to Birmingham three and a half years ago, after retiring from active service with the Packard Motor Company in Detroit with which he was identified as a blacksmith for 17 years, receiving a medal for loyal service.  
 Surviving are the widow, Rella Saul, and a son, Harvey, of Pawtucket, R. I. He was the father of the late Mrs. Ida Roy of Birmingham.  
 Services were held Monday at 1 P. M. from the home and at 2 P. M. from the Royal Oak Methodist Episcopal Church, of which he was a member. Interment was in Evergreen Cemetery.  
 Rev. Saul was ill less than six hours before his death, having been seized by the stroke late Friday morning while working in his yard.
