

POLICE ARREST
95 IN MARCH

Four Held For Felonies;
Violation Bureau Fines—
Total \$165

Birmingham police made 95 arrests in March, four of which resulted from felonies, according to the monthly report of Miss Carrie Strickland, police clerk. A total of \$165.45 was collected in fines at the violation bureau.

Those arrested for felonies included two persons charged with larceny and entering and one with sitting and publishing, while a fourth was held on a fugitive warrant.

Eighteen motorists were arrested for speeding, 65 for violating parking ordinances, three for violating traffic signals, two for reckless driving and three for drunk driving. Others held for misdemeanors included three persons charged with being drunk, three for investigation and four on warrants.

Eleven accidents occurred in the village during the month, and two persons were injured, according to the report. There was one attempted suicide and one reported auto theft which was cleared up.

Police answered 47 calls and investigated 44 complaints. Twenty-three loggers were given sleeping quarters in the village lock-up.
