DEATH CHEATS OFFICER'S RIDE

Serum Carried at Risk of Life Fails To Save Flint Man.

The daring attempt of a State Trooper to save a life, which almost ended disastrously here Wednesday night of last week, met certain defeat in 100 minutes to bring a bottle of the giving serum expired of a strange blood malady in Hurley Hospital.

BOND REFUND PLAN CRYEYED

County Will Attempt 70 Per Cent Exchange Of Covet Obligations

A committee composed of the three members of the County Board of Supervisors and 200 members of the Board of Supervisors is working today on a plan by which it would refund bonds at 70 per cent of the value of the original investment, and in exchange for the standing County road bonds, refunding bonds at 70 per cent of the value of the original investment.

The plan was approved by the supervisors Monday after a long battle ending at 4:30 p. m.

The committee, composed of the Board of Supervisors, Luther D. Allen, Isaac Bond, Sam Howard Hill and supervisors, Fred Lamb, Garner Miller, Frank Shummons, Charles W. Hamilton and Gale O'Leary.

The committee has no authority except to offer the new bonds to the holders of the old bonds. The exchange will be voluntary. It was instructed to obtain the "best possible interest" in the refunding, and to allow the rate paid on the outstanding bonds, which averages about 5 per cent.

Doris was driving the car north on Woodward when the bee flew in and caused her to swerve to the left. She suffered facial bruises and a cut on the left knee, while her sister received lacerations of the forehead. They were treated by Dr. O. D. Beck and later removed to their home.

Damage to the car was estimated by police at \$700.

County Wage CUT APPROVED

The salaries of all elective Oakland County officials will be reduced from 10 to 50 percent beginning Jan. 1 if the action approved by the Board of Supervisors informally Monday is given official sanction at the October session.

The action calls for the salary of the sheriff to be reduced from \$7,000 to \$3,500, and the prosecuting attorney's from \$7,500 to \$4,000.

The county clerk would be cut from \$4,000 to \$2,000; the register of deeds from \$5,000 to \$2,500; the treasurer from \$4,000 to \$2,000; probate judge from \$1,000 to \$500; and train commissioner from \$4,500 to \$2,250.

The informal action Monday was taken after primary candidates in the coming year indicated what salaries they might expect to draw if elected.
