

1ST GAMES SET FOR 'Y LEAGUE

6 Teams To Open Season With Tills Wednesday, Thursday

The Birmingham Y. M. C. A. Basketball League of six teams will launch its 1932-33 season on the Barnum School floor next week with triple-headers on two different nights—Wednesday and Thursday.

Starting at 7 P. M. Wednesday, Van's Pharmacy quintet will meet the Mulholland five; Miller Service will lock horns with Eastern Michigan Motorbus; and the Fellowship Club will tackle the DeMolay basket tossers.

The schedule for the following night, the first game to begin at 7 P. M. also, will find the Fellowship Club pitted against Eastern Michigan; DeMolay matched with Mulholland's; and Van's Pharmacy tangling with Miller Service.

After next week, only three games will be played each week all on Thursday nights and all at Barnum School, according to Robert D. Lynch, Y. M. C. A. secretary and also secretary of the League. The schedule calls for a season of 18 weeks, with a series of play-off games to be scheduled later.

Each team will be allowed two players from outside Birmingham, but all other members must either live or work in the village. Pre-season indicates a point to the Mulholland quintet, which has on its roster several of the members of last year's championship League.
