

# DADS HONORED BY D'MOLAYS

Baldwin Grid Team Also Feted: M. S. C. Coach In Speaker

Football players of Baldwin High School were honored by the Humberger Chapter, Order of DeMolay, Tuesday night at the organization's annual "Dads' Night" program held in the Masonic Temple. Miles Castle, backfield coach of the Michigan State College eleven, was the principal speaker, talking of his favorite sport.

A diversified program of brief talks and musical entertainment preceded Coach Castle's speech. Dalbert Fear, master counselor of the chapter, introduced the master of ceremonies, Elmer Huston.

After a number of group songs, James Kelley and Harry Johnson gave several baritone and guitar duets, and Russell McBride sang three vocal selections.

Bill Marx represented the sons at the meeting in a short talk welcoming the fathers and thanking them for their interest in the DeMolay work. Henry McCurry, Sr., gave the answering address for the fathers.

"Sportsmanship" was the subject of a talk by Coach Miles W. Robinson of Baldwin High School. Mr. Robinson explained the fundamentals of sportsmanship which are taught to grid squads and mentioned the different methods used by coaches in meeting the needs of individual players.

Eland Stroh, who, as a member of the Michigan State team, worked under Coach Castle, introduced the guest speaker.

One of the best assets which a football player may have, in the opinion of a coach, Mr. Castle said, is dependability. A player who can be relied upon to get his man every time or do whatever other job is assigned him is the kind of a player colleges want, he continued.

The coach emphasized the fact that seldom are games won or lost on the Saturday when they are played. "A team wins or loses its confidence on the days it practices," he said. "If the players are used to going through their workouts in a well-ordered manner, they make poor showings during games. The team which generally wins is the team to which the game is a repetition of its practices."
