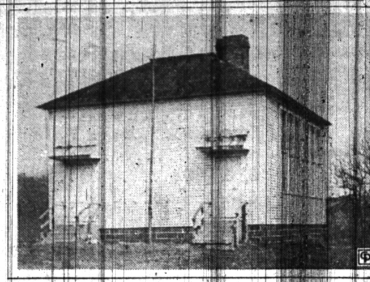


PHILOSOPHER-SCHOLAR TEACHES COUNTRY SCHOOL
