SCHEMERS TO BE SUBJECT OF CONFERENCE

Board Seeks Solution of Debt Problem With Advisory Council

Members of the Board of Education are expected to meet this week with the Municipal Advisory Council in an attempt to work out a feasible solution to the problem confronting the Board from the requests of bondholders for a proportionate share of this winter's tax collection.

The first was a legal opinion from Harry Allen, attorney and village president in which he said the Board was legally obliged to set aside in a special building and fund for taxes charged a sum bearing the same ratio to the total amount of taxes levied as the amount of the debt to be paid during the year bears to the total school budget.

The second was a report detailing the curtailments already made in the system, and setting forth the financial condition of the school district as of the date of the report to the advisory council.

Mr. Allen's opinion, outlining the responsibility of any school board for the debts of the district, is the subject of a conference to be held at the school building on Thursday night.
