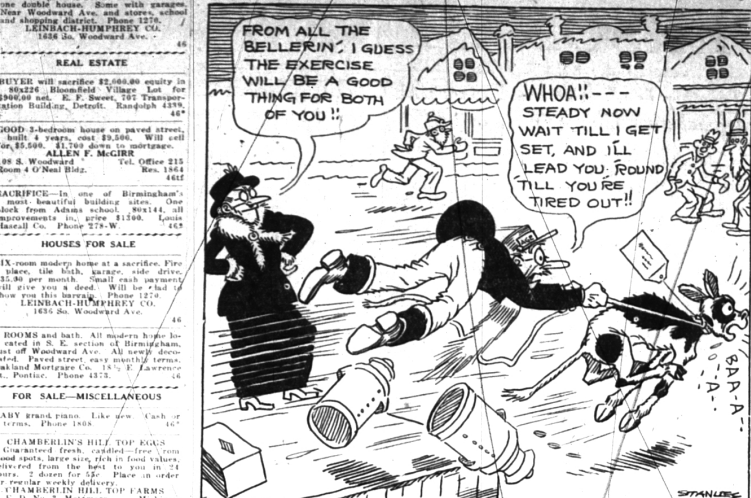

## STANLEY THERON SMITH IS VICTIM OF STROKE

**Brother of Village Scumbos While Acting in Amateur Role**

Theron Smith, prominent citizen of South Lyons, was stricken with a heart attack from which he died several minutes later, as he stepped from the stage Saturday evening while appearing in "The Man in the Green Shirt," an amateur production sponsored by the Ladies Aid Society of the South Lyons Presbyterian Church. Both Mr. Smith and his wife were cast in the play, and the former had made his last exit in the first act when he was taken ill. When the serious nature of his illness was learned the curtain was lowered and the production halted.

Mr. Smith, who was 54 years old, was the brother of Raymond M. Smith of 752 E. Lincoln ave., Birmingham. He had been treasurer of the South Lyons Presbyterian Church for the past nine years. Until seven years ago, he was engaged in the hardware business in South Lyons, from which he retired because of ill health.

He served two terms as township treasurer and as president of the South Lyons Board of Commerce, which office he held at the time of his death.

Besides his widow and brother here, Mr. Smith's family includes two brothers, Fred, of South Haven, and Winfield of Charlotte, Mich.

Funeral services were held Monday in the South Lyons Presbyterian Church, with the Rev. B. Wisnaber officiating. Burial was in New Hudson Cemetery.
