No doubt about it, you can pick up the paper any day, and read of the most astonishing things our feminine fellow-citizens are getting away with.

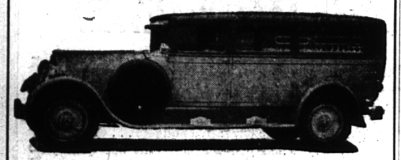
