

WOMAN ACQUITTED AS DRUNK DRIVER

Justice Court Jury Finds Attractive Blond Mother, 27, Not Guilty

A six-man jury in Justice Arthur J. Tuggey's court Saturday morning acquitted Mrs. Leona Rosa, 27 years old, of 5833 Harger street, Dearborn, of drunk driving charges preferred following her arrest here early on the morning of Sunday, Dec. 6.

Mrs. Rosa, an attractive blond and mother of a four-year-old boy, was arrested in company with a male companion on their way towards Detroit. They had been stopped a few hours before when headed toward Pontiac, and Mrs. Rosa had been told to allow her companion to drive the car.

The woman was again at the wheel on the return trip, however, and police claimed her condition was such as to prevent her from driving with safety. She admitted at the trial that she had drank a few glasses of home brew, but denied she was intoxicated.
