## VILLAGERS and the VILLAGE

"A cordial invitation to all the crowd" which daily uses the new commuter service between Birmingham and Detroit has been extended in personal letters to 1,800 persons in Birmingham and vicinity by J. H. Minton, local Grand Trunk agent. Convenience of the service and facilities at the station were emphasized in the letters, which were addressed both to prospects and occasional users of the line.

The first repayment of \$100,000 against the \$300,000 borrowed by the Village of Birmingham in 1930 against delinquent taxes will fall due on Nov. 1. This Wanderer learns from Charles E. Plumstead, village treasurer. This item is not included in the budget for 1932, since it is hoped it will be paid out of taxes already levied and will entail no additional expense during the current year. If the delinquent taxes paid in before the \$100,000 falls due are insufficient to meet the obligation, it will be repaid, Mr. Plumstead says.

Charles B. Randall, vice-president of the First National Bank of Birmingham, yesterday announced that for the year 1931 the bank opened 2235 new accounts, with initial deposits totalling \$1,074,235.49. Compared with 1930, when 1625 new accounts with initial deposits totalling \$522,711.35 were opened, this shows an increase for 1931 of 610 new accounts, amounting to \$551,524.14. The 1931 accounts were divided as follows: 1151 were savings with deposits of \$679,066.60, and 1084 were commercial accounts with deposits of \$304,266.89. Mr. Randall stated that these figures do not include any of the deposits transferred from the Birmingham Savings Bank, which was purchased by the First National in December.
