 WHEREAS, by Act No. 13 of the Public Acts of Michigan 1932 School District No. 1 Fractional Bloomfield is empowered to issue refunding bonds to extend the time of payment of all said maturing bonds for ten years.  
 IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that School District No. 1 Fractional Bloomfield issue its refunding bonds to an amount equal to said maturing bonds.  
 Section A \$5,000 to refund \$5,000 Barnum Heating Bonds dated July 15, 1924 due July 15, 1932 being bonds No. 21-25 inclusive, said issue to consist of five bonds of \$1,000 each and payable at the First National Bank, Birmingham, Michigan on July 15, 1932 with interest at 4 1/2% payable semi-annually on July 15 and January 15 of each year.  
 Section B \$77,500 to refund \$100,000 Baldwin Addition dated September 1, 1923, due September 1, 1932 being bonds No. 21-30 inclusive, said issue to consist of sixteen bonds of \$1,000 each and payable at the First National Bank, Birmingham, Michigan on September 1, 1932 with interest at the rate of 5% payable semi-annually on September 1 and March 1 of each year.

SOLVED, that the proper officers of said School District be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all further steps and do any and all other things that may be necessary to give complete effect to this resolution.

Board of Education Birmingham Public Schools Birmingham, Michigan Gentlemen:

Pursuant to our engagement, we have made an audit of the books and the records of the Birmingham Public Schools, Birmingham, Michigan, for the period June 30, 1931 to June 30, 1932 and submit, herewith, our report containing the following schedules and comments.

Schedule "A"—Treasurer's Fund (Including General, Teachers and Library Funds)  
 Schedule "B"—Athletic Fund  
 Schedule "C"—Analysis of Scrip  
 Schedule "D"—Scrip Redemption Account  
 Schedule "E"—Tax Collections

In making an audit of your books for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1932, a double analysis was necessary in view of the fact that scrip had been issued in payment of outstanding indebtedness. In this connection all actual cash was traced to the depository for each fund, all debentures were therefrom verified and the balances on deposit reconciled with the bank statements.

The Treasurer's Fund (Schedule A) shows all cash receipts during the fiscal year. Scrip Redemption and Special Short Term Loan Accounts and includes also the total amount of Scrip issued. A combination of the cash and scrip in this manner is necessary in order to show a complete picture of the year's operating expenses.

Schedule "B" shows the result of the year's transactions through the Athletic Fund, revealing all expenditure of \$161.51 in excess of receipts for the period.

Schedule "C" sets forth a complete analysis of the Scrip issued. As of June 30, 1932 there remaining outstanding of a total of \$74,570.00 issued, an amount of \$41,960.00.

Schedule "D" reviews the activity of Saving account open in the First National Bank for the purpose of redeeming the Scrip. All Scrip redemption was passed either through this account or credited to the township to apply on their individual tax accounts.


Schedule "E" sets forth in detail an analysis of collection received on tax money for the period. This account supplements tax figures as set forth in Schedule "A" in that included herein are not only actual money received and deposited in the general fund, but also the total amount of Scrip redeemed from township.

We wish to express our appreciation to Mr. Randall and Miss Peterson for their cooperation throughout this engagement and beg to assure you if there is anything further you desire, we shall be only too pleased to furnish same at any time.
