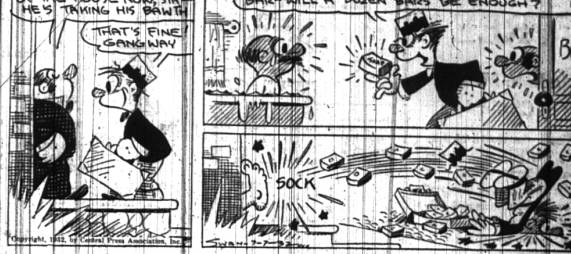

He was deputy director general of transportation supply from 1914 to 1916, and director general of transportation, British Army in France, from 1916 to 1921. He became a member of the Imperial War Cabinet in 1921, and member of the cabinet from 1921 to 1922. Geddes was first lord of the Admiralty from 1922 to 1928 and minister of finance from 1928 to 1931. He served as minister of transport from 1931 to 1932.
