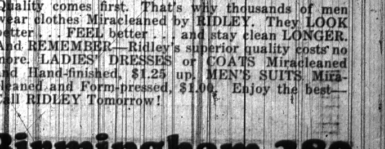
The Messrs Ruth Miller and Ethel Howlett were graduated from the Oakland County Normal School in commencement exercises in Pontiac Tuesday evening.
