**Thursday Musicals, Birmingham Choristers Display Fine Talent**

The Thursday Musicals, assisted by the Birmingham Male Choristers, presented a concert Wednesday evening of last week in the Community House which proved to be a revelation to Birmingham of the talent to be found in the village.

The Thursday Musicals Chorus, directed by Frederick Troutman, with Beryl Haynes at the piano, gave the opening numbers, "Ave Maria" by Schubert, and "The Gypsyes," Brahms-Shelley. Later in the program, "Morning Chorus" by Old was also sung by the women's chorus, and two additional numbers with the assistance of the Choristers.

"Morning Chorus," which incorporates 14 bird call imitations, was unique and highly interesting, and the well-known "Ave Maria" was beautifully done. The Choristers, singing with their best ensemble as a unit, gave a fine performance, adding depth and effectiveness to their light quality. Inevitable in a woman's choir, opportunity should be given to hear this combination many times in the future. Victor Feck sang the solo part, and Beryl Haynes and A. Stanley Hosco were the accompanists. The full chorus of 40 voices and the two grand pianos offered a most impressive ensemble.

Ermine Garay, accompanied by Gail Fairchild Bangs, gave a well-financed performance, singing six songs in two groups. The songs chosen were so widely diversified in subject matter and treatment as to allow Mrs. Garay to show her versatility at its best advantage. The audience was her usual sympathetic support at the piano.

Helen Wagner Neff and Margaret Bailey played six compositions in two groups, all for two pianos. The attack was, from the first number, "Friede" by Beethoven, a marvel of nicety and precision. The opening chords, played in unison were absolutely true.

Mrs. Bailey's smooth tone quality always contrasts and combines happily with Mrs. Neff's clear and fire, and their offerings were warmly received by an audience which was still enthusiastic when the "Andalusian Dance" by Infante brought the concert to a close.

All in all, the entire affair was a great success and something that should be encouraged for the future. Mrs. Norman Lyle, program chairman for the Thursday Musicals, and Mr. Troutman, musical director for both the women's and men's choruses, deserve considerable credit for their parts in an achievement of distinction. The weather was not especially favorable but the hall was filled, and filled with people who appreciated a program not particularly light and popular in tone.—X. V. Z.

**33rd State Fair Board Organized**  
 DETROIT, June 2.—Formal organization of the board of managers of state fairs for the conduct of the Michigan State Fair and Exposition, Sept. 4 to 10, was announced here today, following a meeting of the board called to assign members to various departments, building and other duties during the exposition. The forthcoming fair will mark the 33rd anniversary of the institution.

The board meeting was its first official session this year. It followed a series of informal conferences during the past month with prominent Detroit industrial and business leaders at which the management was assured the fullest co-operation and backing of the city's commercial leaders. A representative Detroit committee and other groups have been named to campaign for a greatly expanded fair in 1932.

All Birmingham school children this week will be given tickets entitling them to free admission to the fair and exposition on the afternoon and evening of Tuesday, Sept. 6, "Young Michigan's Day."

The tickets will be distributed by the Board of Education and are part of the 500,000 being given to as many school children within a radius of 30 miles from Detroit who are to be guests of the fair management on that day. An additional allotment of 325 is being sent to the children of the Big Beaver School.
