

LIBRARY AIDS VACATIONISTS

Readers At Summer Homes To Receive Special Privileges

Arrangements for special summer vacation privileges for patrons of Baldwin Public Library were announced yesterday by Mrs. Nancy B. Thomas, librarian.

"Library patrons going to summer homes and camps may borrow books with the privilege of keeping them longer than the customary two weeks, providing arrangements are made before the books are taken out," Mrs. Thomas said.

Similar privileges were extended last summer, and scores of readers took advantage of them, she said.

A total of 42 new books have been added to the library's shelves during the past month, 39 of which were gifts. The circulation for May amounted to 8,314, or a gain of 222 over the corresponding month last year. Forty new registrations were received.

Those who donated books included Mrs. A. C. Utter, Mrs. E. Rice, Miss Eva Fowler, T. K. Tamm, Mrs. Russell Malcolm and Mrs. Bruce Platt.

Village Orders 24 Trees Felled

Dead or Diseased, They Are Hazards and Breeding Places, Olin Says

A total of 24 trees in the older section of the village, most of them dead or diseased, were ordered removed in a resolution adopted by the Village Commission Monday following a hearing at which no one appeared to protest the action.

Emil G. Olin, village forester, recommended removal of the trees, which he said were a hazard to the public and breeding places for insects.

Village Manager James W. Partridge was instructed to inquire whether the trees would be acceptable as firewood for use in return for their helping in removing and cutting them.

Mr. Olin was asked to remind the Commission as to the proper date for planting trees next fall when it is intended at least partially to be replaced with new trees.

The trees ordered removed include the following:
Sage maples at corner of Pierce and Martin streets, 628 Pierce street, 571 Bates street, 500 Townsend, 283 Merrill, 348 Bates, 568 Merrill, 813 Martin, two at 618 Everett, 718 Forest, 156 at 388 Pierce, 947 Henrietta, corner of 383 George and 283 Greenwood; hickory at 968 Purdy; Poplar at 170 Martin; pines at corner Oak and Hazelwood and 367 Hamilton, and one cherry tree at corner Haynes and Bowers on Adams road.
