No Need For Tax Boost, Kentucky Salon Asserts

Logan Advocates Starting Economies To Balance Federal Budget

"THE MOST DRASTIC reduction program which I hear mentioned," said the senator, "contemplates cuts aggregating about a billion, with higher taxes approximating a billion, to balance the federal budget."

"Failing adoption of the economic method of solving our budget problem, my personal judgment is that we are very close to the finish of the governmental system bequeathed to us by our revolutionary forefathers."

JUDGE LOGAN (the Kentucky lawmaker was a veteran of the Blue Grass state Court of Appeals when elected to the Senate) tilted back in his office chair and considered the situation calmly.

"AT THE PRESENT RATE," said the senator, "I foresee many more of these small rebellions—one out on the Pacific coast for example; then one in Florida, possibly; then, maybe, in Maine and Arkansas which are more and more of them—probably suppressed here and there by the militia, but gradually multiplying and merging into one another."

"In one southern Kentucky county, I'm told, the citizenry has announced that this year it will not pay taxes; it wouldn't be healthy. Perhaps the state will insist on its share, but it may have employed the national guard to collect it."

"This debacle need not be anticipated as practically inevitable," agreed the Kentucky statesman, "if we could have reactably for real governmental economy. But can we? I doubt it."

"OUR PAST DEPRESSIONS," observed the senator, "have been bad enough, but of 1893's, the worst in recent years, was this to be said, anyway—money had been concentrated in too few hands and the average individual was penniless, but our debts were not heavy. Now, not only is our money gone, but our credit is exhausted. The end even of the federal government's is in sight."
