

# High School Cagers Lose Final S. E. A. A. Contest

## ADRIAN TRIMS MAPLES, 33-13

Baldwin Quintet Scores But One Field Goal In Last S. E. A. A. Tilt

Limited to one field goal, the Baldwin High School cagers were defeated by a sharp-shooting Adrian five Friday evening in the Baldwin gym, 33 to 13. Canever, Maple left guard, tallied his team's lone field goal as the final whistle sounded.

Adrian's excellent passing attack and defense completely baffled the Baldwin squad for the first half. The Maples, when they did get possession of the ball, were not in any position to score. The score at the end of the first half was 18 to 4, with the visitors leading.

Displaying a faster brand of ball-playing in the third period Coach Whitney's five held their own, and each team scored but three points. Adrian's pivot play which had caused all the trouble in the first half was solved and checked during this quarter.

Both teams played fast and roughly during the last quarter without much interference on the part of the officials. Adrian piled up 11 points while the Maples were unable to score for the remainder of the game.

The contest marked the close of the regular season and was the last Southeastern league game for the Maroon and White.

After making a perfect record in the first three league games, Birmingham dropped four in a row, placing seventh for the season.

On Friday, Mar. 11, the team will journey to Rochester for the first game of the Regional Tournament.

The second team again lost to the All-Stars Friday, this time by a score of 25 to 13. Miller and Brown of the All-Star led the scoring column with eight points apiece.
