Indian Student Exchange Speaker

U. of M. Post-Graduate Traces Economic Unrest, Leads Gandhi

"What this world needs is a balance of production with distribution, to the end that famine, depression, and other maladjustments of human relations may be done away with," Dr. C. G. Kulkarni, of India, told Birmingham Exchanges in a talk at the Community House Tuesday noon. Dr. Kulkarni is taking a post-graduate course in political philosophy at the University of Michigan. He was introduced to the Exchanges by Oscar Peterson, president.

The speaker traced the present national disorders in most of the so-called civilized countries today, and pointed out that the United States, in spite of its economic affluence, is the least governed and the most prosperous land in the world.

The troubles of modern India with Great Britain were discussed by Dr. Kulkarni, who hailed Gandhi as the most powerful influence in the world among living men. "Dr. Gandhi is India's great strength today," said the speaker. "When Gandhi recently left the London round table conference, where India's problems were supposed to be solved, he said: 'The British lion may rear its way about India, scaring the lambs of my country. But remember this great statement, that the meek shall inherit the earth.'"
