"WHAT IS THE P.T.A.?"

What does the Parent-Teacher Association mean to Birmingham? The two presidents of the local organizations in the Birmingham Public Schools have been asked to discuss this question this week and next on the women's pages of The Economist.

Mrs. E. W. Osborne, president of the P. T. A. at Baldwin School, summarizes the aims of her organization as follows:

"There are three points often mentioned in my statement regarding the P. T. A. which are clear.

The first usually includes three questions, 'What is it? What do you do?' Why is it important?"

"The answer to one suffices for all. The P. T. A. is the union of parent and teachers to help children in any way we can. Following this, we act directly and indirectly through various channels.

Last year our unit furnished the teacher's room at the school to give them a quiet place to work.

"We have a program set up to acquaint teachers and officers.

Now, we are knee-deep in a campaign to raise funds for mill and grain cracker for underprivileged children.

Our unit has contributed \$100 and can count only on a possible \$10 to come from dues, we are depending on both teachers and parents to enable us to succeed in this plan.

"The second point often brought to my attention is the remark, 'I've lived here a year and no one has ever mentioned the P. T. A.' If this I reply that there are no closed meetings of the P. T. A. Anyone interested may attend.

"As our membership numbers between 500 and 600, the officers and it impossible to make individual contacts. However, notices of meetings are sent to a majority of the members.

"The third question is 'Is it a social organization?' We are social, and have many good times with our families, but our main purpose is to further the cause of education and to foster community spirit and to give churches and local organizations an opportunity to raise funds for their own use," Mrs. Osborne explained.

"As our units are co-operating with our sister units in the P. T. A. of Pierco School, the Women's Literary Club, the League of Women Voters and the local branch of the National Federation of University Women in a study group, cover orientation and elementary, and high school procedure.

"There are other important movements in which we are interested, including the Boy Scouts, the summer round-up of children and educational projects. In short, we do what we can for our children and we do it by learning by working, by friendliness and by that magic touch—'co-operation'."
