

**Veterans To Meet For Reunion Picnic**  
 Old Camp Grounds At Island Lake To Re-Live Scenes Of War With Spain

Brighton, Mich., Sept. 1.—Hundreds of Michigan veterans of the Spanish-American War will make a reunion picnic at Island Lake near Brighton, Sunday, for the first time since the memorable days of '98, when a mammoth reunion and picnic was staged to revivify the Spanish-

American War veterans of this state. Loose ends of the arrangements are being brought together and present indications are for the biggest gathering of veterans in many years. It is expected that many veterans of other wars, including the late one, will accept the invitation of the committee and be there in force.

The Michigan state commanders of the United Spanish-American War Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion are expected to be present. Quite a few of the veterans camps have indicated that they will come accompanied by their drum corps, and at least one full band that of the Howell Legion post, will be another attraction.

Governor Bricker will speak at 4:30 in the afternoon.

Island Lake, where the gathering will be held, is now the site of one of the largest state parks of Michigan, and space is afforded for hundreds of visitors. The ample facilities for the entertainment of both children and adults, was here in 1926, with the erection of "Remember the Maine" ringing in their ears, that the Michigan troops might have been sent to the Spanish-American War.
