ADITORS ASK President's Day Observed Despite The President

De Visser Opposes It At Oakland Hills, But Men-bers Oppose Him

The Ways and Means and Salaries Committee of the Oakland County Board of Supervisors has before it today a proposed budget for 1933 of \$2,233,000, or \$413,224.90 more than last year's budget and 50 percent below the appropriation for 1932. The proposal, presented by the Board of Auditors Monday, includes an item of \$1,000,000 for relief which will not be needed if the supervisors decide to return the problem of welfare supervision to the individual cities.

The proposed budget recommends a payroll reduction of 40.4 percent, although even this is not so drastic as some of the recommendations previously made by the Salaries Committee of the Board of Supervisors, which last asked that the salaries of elective officials be slashed from 10 to 50 percent. The pay cuts asked are referred to its own recommendations over those of the auditors. The auditors' proposals contemplate discontinuance of the County Normal School, County Conservator Department, County Fair and Feralds Markets. The largest single appropriation, with the exception of \$364,253.31 for bond and interest payments, of which \$200,000 would be used to meet payments on issues previously refunded. Salary cuts recommended by the auditors include the following: sheriff from \$7,100 to \$4,500; combined salaries of sheriff's assistants from \$29,220 to \$23,100; prosecutor from \$7,000 to \$5,000; combined salaries of prosecutor's assistants from \$23,220 to \$23,370; probate judge from \$7,000 to \$5,000; register of deeds from \$5,000 to \$4,000; school commissioner from \$5,000 to \$3,000, and treasurer from \$5,900 to \$4,000.

Courts Appropriation The recommended appropriation for upkeep of the Circuit Courts, although in the health department, the elimination of one of three physicians is recommended, together with salary cuts for the other two. The Board of Supervisors now adjourned, will meet again Friday morning when it is expected to appoint a member to the Board of Trustees of the Oakland County Tuberculosis Sanatorium and one member to the Road Commission. Applications for the place on the committee are expected to come Monday from Richard Bowden, of Ince Road, whose term expires, and also understood to be a candidate for re-appointment.

SPRINGSTEEN TO RUN ON STICKERS

Defeated Candidate Runs Sheriff's Department and 'Old Line Democrats'

County Tax Bill RUMOR IS DENIED Supervisors Refute Claim Of Moore's Opponents That He Proposed Statement For \$9,000

Mr. Moore, Pontiac attorney general, presented a bill to Oakland County for legal services in fighting the State Tax Commission valuation at his political opponents in the township's governing boards, according to a statement issued by Supervisors Perry, A. J. Oliver, P. Gibbs of Avon and A. J. Gale of Waterford. Despite the fact the rumor was circulated that Mr. Moore had presented a bill to the county for \$9,000, standing for attorneys' fees, the statement said that the township suits against the Tax Commission which were filed last year in the Michigan State Senate by a substantial majority.

County Value Cut Raymond of Detroit was associated with Mr. Moore, the township counsel in the suits, and the township, the valuation, eventually in a reduction of approximately \$100,000. The supervisors of the three townships felt that the entire county could well afford to share in the expense of the litigation in view of the fact that the county would be reimbursed for this valuation, the statement said.

"The statement of Board of Supervisors presented an account of \$20,000 fee for legal services to the Board of Supervisors rendered to the township of Waterford, Avon and Bloomfield, and no person receives any claim of any kind whatsoever for the county for attorneys' fees for legal services rendered in connection with any matter whatever."
