League Of Six Teams To Begin Play About Dec. 1

Definite assurance that the Birmingham Y. M. C. A. will again sponsor a league of amateur football teams this winter was given last night at a second meeting of team managers in the "Y" building.

The league will probably be limited to six teams, according to Robert D. Lynd, secretary of the Y. M. C. A. Approximately the number has already indicated a willingness to join, and other teams interested have been asked to get in touch with Mr. Lynd before final organization plans are completed.

Play is expected to begin about Dec. 1 and will continue for about 10 weeks. All games will be played on Wednesday nights at the Harman School court. There will be three games each week.

Each team meeting every other team at least twice in the course of the regular schedule. Arrangements for the championship playoffs have not been completed.

All players who participated in the league last year will be automatically eligible again this season, as well as any others living in the Birmingham school district.

Coaches represented at the meeting included the following: J. H. Humphreys, Eastern Michigan University; DeMolay, Stroup's Marine Fellowship Club, and Fernside League (played last year as Vogue Cleaners).

New Recount Law Halts Candidates
