HELPS RESCUE LOST MARINES

Birmingham Youth, in Nicaragua, Relates Experience in Letters

A Birmingham youth's role in the recent rescue of a lost Marine detachment in the Nicaragua campaign is related in letters received here by his family. The youth is Gilbert Mintling, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Mintling, 48 Townsend street.

Mintling is attached to the machine gun crew of the 1st Battalion, U. S. Marine Corps, at the Marine Corps training center at Parris, Fla. He was transferred to Pensacola, Fla., for aviation training and later to the Marine Corps.

Since May, 1931, he has been a manager of the 18 months of the Birmingham-Hill School, Birmingham. He expects to leave Birmingham either at that time or in the fall to attend the Marine Corps training center.

Mintling relates the part of the rescue and to an executive I have been acquainted and inspired by men and women who know what an executive really is.

Mintling says that some of the officers and non-commissioned officers own horses, but most of the men have tamed native animals, such as spider monkeys, brown face monkeys, parrots, parakeets, orange birds, larks, small deer, mice

cube, banana rats, iguanas, and armadillos.

Mintling himself has tamed a small parrot, or parrot bear, which he described as about the size of a guinea pig, long-haired, rat-coon-like in appearance, and has

ing a pointed snout with which to root in the ground for insects.

Unique foods are sometimes eaten by the Marines in the vicinity. Mintling writes, "Natives here eat armadillo and the lizard called an iguana," he says. "Both taste very much like chicken. Snake
