## Petitions For U.S. Loans Nearly Ready

Applications from the City of Birmingham to the Federal Government for grants and loans to cover the cost of two proposed public works projects under the National Recovery Act will be forwarded either this week or early next week, City Manager James W. Parry said yesterday.

Details data which the Government requires with the applications is being rapidly compiled and will be dispatched to Washington as soon as it is completed, Mr. Parry said.

The two projects for which funds will be raised are a sewage disposal plant and a water treatment plant. The cost of the sewage disposal plant has been estimated at about \$367,000, and a water treatment plant with artificial water making estimated at about \$181,000.

Formal decisions to make application for the loan for the water treatment plant are expected to be made by the city council on Monday night. Applications for the sewage disposal plant had previously been voted.

No figures are yet available as to the actual effect the NRA program has had to date in Birmingham on wages and employment, but a survey to ascertain these facts will be begun by the Assistant City Manager shortly. Details of the program are better known, Mr. LaBelle said.

(Continued from Page 1) suggestions, and is expected to be ready for submission to the depositors within two weeks.

"A large percentage of the deposits in the bid bank were represented by public officials of the various municipalities, and this tentative plan has been submitted to several of these bodies for consideration," Mr. Allen continued.

"Last Monday, the plan was outlined to the Oakland County Board of Supervisors, which appointed a committee consisting of members of the Board and members of the county treasurer and members of the Board of Auditors to study the proposal and make recommendations to the full Board when the committee plan is ready for submission."

"It is understood that the plan in its present form may be changed in some aspects by either the comptroller's department or by the committee, before it is presented to the depositors. Present plans call for the appointment of five trustees to hold office until Jan. 1, at which time the Board of Trustees will be elected by the depositors. Two trustees will be elected each year thereafter for the life of the trust."

**Criticism**

"The committee members here

felt that this plan will be most beneficial to the community generally, inasmuch as it will be administered by a group of Birmingham business men who should know the needs and requirements of the community better than any outsider who would be controlled by the precedents established in his case as received and committed to liquidate at a disastrous sacrifice.

The plan was also given the endorsement of Charles E. James, who is now federal conservator for the county, but who plans to resign Sept. 1 to devote his full-time to his office of executive vice-president of the new Birmingham National Bank.

It was disclosed that Mr. James expressed his resignation to the Washington office of the NRA, effective as of Aug. 1, but that the committee prevailed upon him to express to the comptroller a willingness that action on the resignation be held up until Sept. 1. This was done to enable the committee to allow sufficient time for whatever action might be necessary in furthering plans for the trusteeship and dealing away with the necessity of appointing a new conservator.

In commenting on the plan itself, Mr. James declared that he is "co-operating wholeheartedly with the committee" and feels that if the plan can be worked out, it will prove highly beneficial to the depositors."

The boys were added to the club when the theft occurred on Aug. 1.
