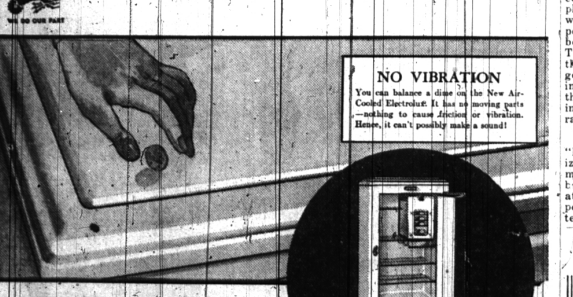


**SOMEONE IS ABOUT TO GET A JOB**
