# New Pittsburgh Mayor Is "Nut" on Single Tax Issue

## First Democrat To Run Smoky City In 25 Years Is U. of M. Law Graduate

It is a surprise to many of the city's residents that the first Democrat to run for mayor of Pittsburgh in 25 years is a University of Michigan law graduate. He headed the State Lumber League for years.

He is a student of Gaetano Filangieri, early Italian gangster, and reads him in Italian. As a matter of fact, he campaigned in Italian districts by making speeches in Italian.

Stories about him? He likes to tell of how he and William Reay, candidate for governor of Pennsylvania, went broke on a campaign tour and had to "bum" two bits for coffee and doughnuts. And of how President Wilson once gave him advice he never followed: "Democrats shouldn't say too much about free-trading in industrial Pennsylvania."

One of McNair's outstanding hobbies is housing. He's conducting a personal campaign for slum eradication.

A major problem that confronts him is to find a place for his old friend, Perry Rodgers, proprietor of a small downtown lunchroom, to set up business now that wreckers are tearing down his place. For 30 years McNair has eaten daily at the Rodgers' tiny place—because years ago Rodgers staked him day after day "until I could get a law case or two."

And one thing more. The new mayor hopes to take tiny Ober Park in the heart of the busy north side and make it a shrine of free speech. You wouldn't know, of course, that in 1912 he was pulled from a soap box by Republican-directed police and thrown into a police station cell to finish the Democratic majority speech he was making in that very park!
