EDUCATION BEGINS EARLY

"With this toy the baby of 12 months begins to educate himself," she told the eager group of mothers near her. "He seizes upon the oblong board with its four square holes. Believe me, it's a wise baby who won't put a square peg into a round hole. These bright-colored pegs are tinted with vegetable dyes so your baby won't be injured if he puts them into his mouth. Like all other good baby toys, these are lacking in dangerously sharp corners.

"Instead of little cubes bearing pictures and letters of the alphabet that you as babies played with, youngsters nowadays have blocks of quite another kind. Made of natural wood with corners smoothed off and rounded, the new blocks are of varying sizes and shapes to fit the baby's hand, and putting them in place for whatever is building.

"From one year to a dozen, the same principle is employed in the making of toys," generalized Mrs. Jones as she pointed out to the mothers outstanding illustrations. "Give the child the wherewithal to make something—something in the making of which his head as well as his hands are employed."

"Mrs. Jones," I said, "you and I have been driving toward the same goals, only you have the toys right before the parents to see and handle as you teach your lessons."
