Will Soviet Trade Benefit South? President's "I Order" Causes Shiver Tammany Embarrasses La Guardia

NEW YORK, Dec. 7.—"What part of the United States will benefit most by Russian trade?" "One may guess that the South would benefit most—for cotton is being sold the greatest item of export."

A study prepared by the New York Cotton Exchange estimates that if Russia consumed as much cotton per capita as the United States, the trade in raw cotton would be \$6,000,000 a year. Russian consumption at present is 2.5 million per capita against 25 pounds in the United States.

F. D. R. CAUSES SHIVERS
