BOY FATALLY SHOT BY 'UNLOADED' GUN

Thanksgiving Day Tragedy Takes Life of Two-Year-Old in Troy Township Home

The body of two-year-old Harold Penningsdorf was taken Saturday from the G. Dewey Kimball Funeral Home here to Attica, Mich., for burial, following the child's death on Thanksgiving Day from the discharge of an "unloaded" shotgun.

While his mother looked on, Harold was shot in the jaw and neck and died almost instantly when the gun was fired by the boy's nine-year-old uncle, Chester Hasslet. The holiday tragedy occurred at the Penningsdorf home on East Maple road, near John R road, in Troy Township.

Harold was playing on the floor with his sister, Loraine, four years old, when their father and the young uncle entered the house after an unsuccessful hunting excursion. The father has been out of work for several months and had been attempting to provide food to take the place of a Thanksgiving turkey.

The father had told Chester the gun was not loaded. He had removed five shells from the weapon, and had been handed a sixth shell by a companion, which he causted with, and thereby removed, causing him to believe all six had been taken out.

While he was taking the gun upstairs, pulled the trigger as he passed the children playing on the floor. Five times the hammer clicked without harm. A loud report followed the sixth pressure on the trigger, and Harold fell dead. The shot narrowly missed the boy's sister.
